# RECENT DEVELOPMENTS ON ECD AT NATIONAL LEVEL



□ ECD being given increased focus in ESSP – especially in the context of school readiness.

#### Why this increased focus?

- ✓ 2010-2011 GoR reading assessments (EGRA-Early Grade Reading Assessment- and LARS-Learning Assessment in Rwanda School-by UNESCO): poor early-grade reading attainment.
- ✓ International evidence demonstrates that intervening early with a school readiness programme can revert this trend and overall improve learning outcomes.







Sector Outcome no. 7: Improved access to school readiness programmes by 2017/18, accompanied by expanded access to three-years of early learning for four-to-six-year olds.

- ☐ responding to the education sector's commitments within the National ECD Policy, which was adopted in September 2011.
- □ A community-based strategy will be employed, with community contributions complementing Government financing and inputs
- □ Responsibilities shared between the Ministry of Education, the Communities and the Development Partners



## ECD in the Education Sector Strategic Plan 2013/2014 - 2017/2018 (Cnt'd)



#### The Ministry of Education:

- Provide oversight to the standards and quality of preprimary programmes through the development of national ECD standards and ECD packages for caregivers and preschool teacher training.
- ☐ School-based physical infrastructure for pre-primary learning spaces
- ☐ Extending the capitation grant to the pre-primary subsector
- ☐ Coordinate ECCD integration through ECCD Task Force.



## ECD in the Education Sector Strategic Plan 2013/2014 - 2017/2018 (Cnt'd)



### The Community:

- ☐ Financial contribution towards the cost of hiring pre-school teachers and also in school feeding programmes, where they exist,
- ☐ Parents acting as care-givers, providing and cooking food and other such inputs, to allow families to contribute according to their means;

#### Development partners:

- ☐ Contribution to the cost of expansion; technical support for development and oversight of standards; input in preprimary curriculum revision.
- ☐ Targeted indicators: Enrolment rate moves from 12.9 % in school year 2012-2013 to 29.9% in 2017-2018.



## **ECD** in the Health Sector Strategic Plan

#### Ministry of health

- ☐ The Rwanda HSSP has one of the implementation channels education structures. This refers to primary education and nursery/ECD. The Rwanda HSSP intends to target children under five through community health strategy. These children will be reached using the community health workers in their health and nutrition activities.
- ☐ The community Based Nutrition Program target children under five. These program has a big impact on the nutrition status, behavior and practices of the mothers of young children, which in turn has a bigger impact on child physical, cognitive and emotional development.







#### Learning Lab on Toys and Learning materials

- ☐ Took place at Save the Children Office on 29<sup>th</sup> May
- □ 12 participants took place in the event including representatives of WELLSPRING FOUNDATION, UMUHUZA, VSO, A PARTNER IN EDUCATION STRIVE FOUNDATION, KUNDA UMWANA, CARE and SAVE THE CHILDREN.
- A presentation was made by each represented organization on what kind of toys and materials are used in their supported programme for ECD children learning + Q&A session.

- ☐ The study visit was conducted to 2 ECCD Centres supported by STRIVE in Musanze on 29<sup>th</sup> May.
