

Rwanda Operations Coordinator Educate!

Educate! has a unique opening for a new leadership role in our second country of operation. The Rwanda Operations Coordinator role provides an opportunity to apply your administration skills, finance and/or M&E expertise, and entrepreneurialism on a small team.

Educate! is a high-growth, award-winning education social enterprise. Our top priority as an organization is scaling up in Uganda and expanding to new countries. In Uganda, we work in 10% of secondary schools, reaching over 80,000 students. In Rwanda, we are taking a different approach by working through government to support the national competence-based curriculum reform for entrepreneurship subject. Educate! works closely with three partners Rwanda Education Board, Akazi Kanoze Access and Innovations for Poverty Action. The program is called the E!Exchange and will be evaluated in a Randomized Control Trial (RCT).

The Rwanda Operations Coordinator will be at the center of our fast-moving country start-up and will have the opportunity to support the pilot of an entrepreneurship teacher training program reaching 10 districts and approximately 100 schools intensively. We need a master organizer who is energized and driven to lead the operations to ensure Educate! creates a lasting impact on students.

About Educate!

Educate! is a fast-growing non-profit social enterprise, currently operating in Uganda and imminently expanding across East Africa and beyond. We deliver to secondary school youth a skills-based model of education, comprised of leadership and entrepreneurship training, mentorship, and real experience starting an enterprise, and work to incorporate our model into national education systems across Africa. Our Vision for 2024 is to impact 1 million youth annually across 10 countries in Africa.

Educate! is backed by top funders such as The MasterCard Foundation, Echidna Giving, Barr, Segal, Vitol, Planet Wheeler, and Halloran Philanthropies, and featured by Brookings and the Clinton Global Initiative. Educate! team members have won recognition from Forbes 30 under 30, Echoing Green, Ashoka, Global Good Fund, and three Acumen fellowships. We value retention of great people: eight of our top thirteen programs team members have been with Educate! for at least six years.

We manage aggressively to impact, and our Randomized Control Trial – the gold standard of impact evaluation – shows that our students double their incomes by the end of the program.

Rwanda Operations Coordinator Objectives

• Finance (35%)

Educate! will be implementing teacher training using an innovative peer-to-peer teacher network for school based training and using district level youth leaders. Most of the finances will be managed by our implementing partner, Akazi Kanoze Access who will submit accountabilities to the Operations Coordinator for review. The Operations Coordinator will also be responsible for managing all Educate! finance systems, payments, and bookkeeping for Educate!'s 5 person team. This also includes any legal filing.

Monitoring (30%)

Educate! will be working together with our implementing partner to ensure all major aspects of the program are implemented. Monitoring will include weekly visits to schools, attending teacher trainings and events, and weekly calls to district master trainers and subject specific leaders. The Operations Coordinator is responsible for managing all monitoring equipment, forms, and data entry.

Administration (15%)

Educate! will maintain a rented house for internationals, guests and trainings. The Operations Coordinator will be responsible for all administration related to the house, any office space, and administration related to printing materials, organizing events and conducting trainings.

• Reporting (10%)

The Rwanda Operations Coordinator's role is to liaise with the Educate! Regional Operations & Finance Director to ensure high quality program implementation. This entails managing systems for feedback from the field, rolling out new policy communications and changes, and providing technical assistance where necessary to ensure the implementing partner operations run smoothly.
